Travel time between the airport and the meeting venue(s) is estimated to one hour.


# Arrival on Wednesday 22 May

The meeting venue (*Professorboligen*) on **Wednesday 22/5** is downtown and <u>400 meter (5 minute walk)</u> from the airport train station named "*Nasjonalteateret*" (the National Theatre). The <u>airport train</u> departs with 10 minute intervals with a travel time of 25 minutes to this station. At best, one hour travel time from the airplane has landed to the meeting venue should be possible, if you plan well. With the meeting starting at 13 it might *perhaps* be possible to arrive just on time with a flight landing at 12.




# Departure on Friday 24 May

The meeting venue on **Friday 24/5** is at the museum (*Tøyen Manor*) and <u>650 meter (8 minute walk)</u> from the subway station named "*Tøyen*". The subway departs with <u>2-3 minute interval</u> and a travel time of 3-4 minutes to the central station [*Alternatively there is <u>1.7 km and 21 minutes walk</u> from the museum to the <u>central station</u>]. At the central station the airport train departs with 10 minute intervals and a 19 minute travel time to the airport. One hour from the venue to the airport should be possible - and arriving at the airport one hour before the flight is normally sufficient time. If we close the meeting at 12, it might perhaps be possible, if you plan very well, to make a flight departure at 14 - and departure after 15-16 should be fine.*

# Tuesday 21 May - field trip to Hovedøya

Field trip (21 May) meeting point is downtown at Akers Brygge and approximately one hour travel time from the airport. We plan to meet (before 14) and depart at 14:00 with the ferry to the island.

The island <u>Hovedøya</u> is located less than 2 km with 8 minutes travel time by a <u>passenger ferry departing</u> every hour (..., 13:00, 14:00, 15:00, ...).

The departure of the ferry is from "Aker Brygge" 600 meter (8 minutes walk) from the

"Nasjonalteateret" station of the airport train. We plan to meet for the departure at 14:00, and you should be able to make this time with a flight arriving before 12:00.
